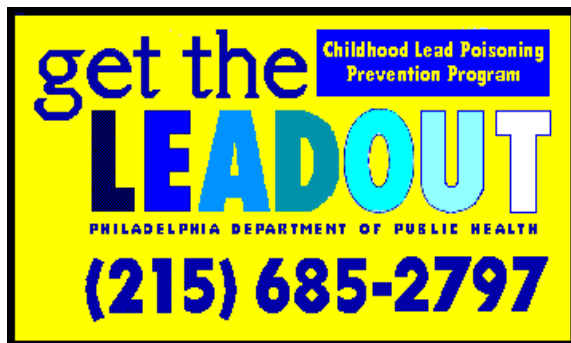

Free Cleaning Supplies!

What you can do now:



Wash your child's hands often to remove lead dust.



Wash your child's toys and pacifiers often to remove lead dust.



Wash hard surfaces like floors and windows 1 day a week, to remove dust.



Give your baby foods high in calcium vitamin C and iron.



Wipe your feet! Keep lead dust *outside*.



Do not dry-scrape or burn paint.



Have your baby tested for lead poisoning at 9 months old, and again on their 2nd and 3rd birthdays.



Over 95% of the homes in Philadelphia contain lead. Over 3,000 children had high blood lead levels in 2006*. Lead can harm a child for the rest of his life. So you must *prevent* your child from being lead poisoned.
